- In Chapter 34, three possible variations of Operation Stroke are mentioned. Discuss the ramifications of each.
- 4. Who are the four musketeers and what happens to each one?
- 5. No one in this novel is as he appears to be. Discuss the characters from this perspective.
- 6. Do you think this Cold War novel is still relevant today?
