
Nelson DeMille

From *New York Times* bestselling authors Nelson DeMille and Alex DeMille, *Blood Lines* features the return of Special Agents Brodie and Taylor who are on the hunt for the cold-blooded murderer of one of their fellow agents.

Army Criminal Investigation Agents Scott Brodie and Maggie Taylor have been separated for five months following their last assignment, a dangerous mission in Venezuela to locate and detain an infamous Army deserter. Now, in Berlin, they are reunited and tasked with investigating the murder of one of their own: CID Special Agent Harry Vance of the 5th MP Battalion, an accomplished counter terrorism agent who had been stationed in western Germany, and whose body was discovered in a city park in the heart of Berlin's Arab refugee community.



Book Club Questions for Discussion

- 4. Were there any new or secondary characters in *Blood Lines* that stood out to you? If so, what made them memorable or intriguing?
- 5. What did you think about the pacing of *Blood Lines*? Were there any parts that felt too slow or too rushed?

- 6. Do you think Scott Brodie and Maggie Taylor make a good team? Why or why not?
- 7. What are your thoughts about the third person narration of *Blood Lines* versus first person narration in many other Nelson DeMille books?
- 8. Would you be interested in reading more about Scott Brodie and Maggie Taylor in future novels?
- 9. Did you enjoy the ending of *Blood Lines*? Why? Or why not?
- 10. Do you think that these books would make a good TV series? Who do you see as the male and female lead?
- 11. Discuss the challenges that might arise from a father and son collaborating on a novel.
